Hi Folks.

Just to bring you up to date on some of our current and future projects. Also the proposed programme for next year.

- a) Waddon I have completed the section where the tree had caused problems I had a lovely day up there last Wed. (the sun was out and the view was brilliant, it wasn't even cold). I finished about 4.00 but by the time I'd tidied up the stone and put the fence back it was dark and I didn't half scare the sheep as I walked back over the field.
- b) Goulds Hill Phyllis and I were up there on 6<sup>th</sup>. It was EXTREMELY muddy but we had a good day the foundations are complete to fill in the gap up to what was built on the last course and Phyllis got nearly up to the top on the bit that was already started. We plan to complete the gap before the April course next year.
- c) Tyneham a few people have re-set the gatepost and finished the adjoining wall in the farmyard.







We have some exciting projects coming up at Tyneham. Lynda has persuaded the army to buy 18 ton of stone for us which will be used over a couple of years: to build a picnic table and benches in the farmyard and to build a curved wall at the entrance to finish off the bit that goes over the bridge. Dave has designed a way of incorporating stones to spell out Tyneham Farmyard. The top of the picnic table might be finished off with massive stone slabs which would look very impressive – but only if we can get a grant that we have applied for, otherwise we'll have to think again.

Other projects in the pipe-line for next year are to finish Goulds Hill, to re-build some of the wall around the car park at Renscombe (Worth Matravers, above Chapman's pool) and to complete the wall at Upwey where I built my curve this year. There is also another section at Waddon which I think will come down over the Winter – so there is plenty to do.

I am attaching the calendar of proposed dates for next year but the actual venues haven't been finalised yet. We will probably tend to be at Tyneham in the early part of the year when the weather isn't so good. Waddon, of course, is better in the sunshine. So, keep the dates free and we'll fill them in as and when things become clearer.

There are 2 possible weekends ear-marked in January – 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> or 18<sup>th</sup>/19<sup>th</sup> but we will only do one – play it by ear depending on the weather so I'll let you know nearer the time. Our next activity will be the social – on 1<sup>st</sup> Feb. This is lunch (off the menu but choices in advance) followed by skittles at the Royal Oak in Bere Regis. Again, more details in the New Year but save the date for now.
